



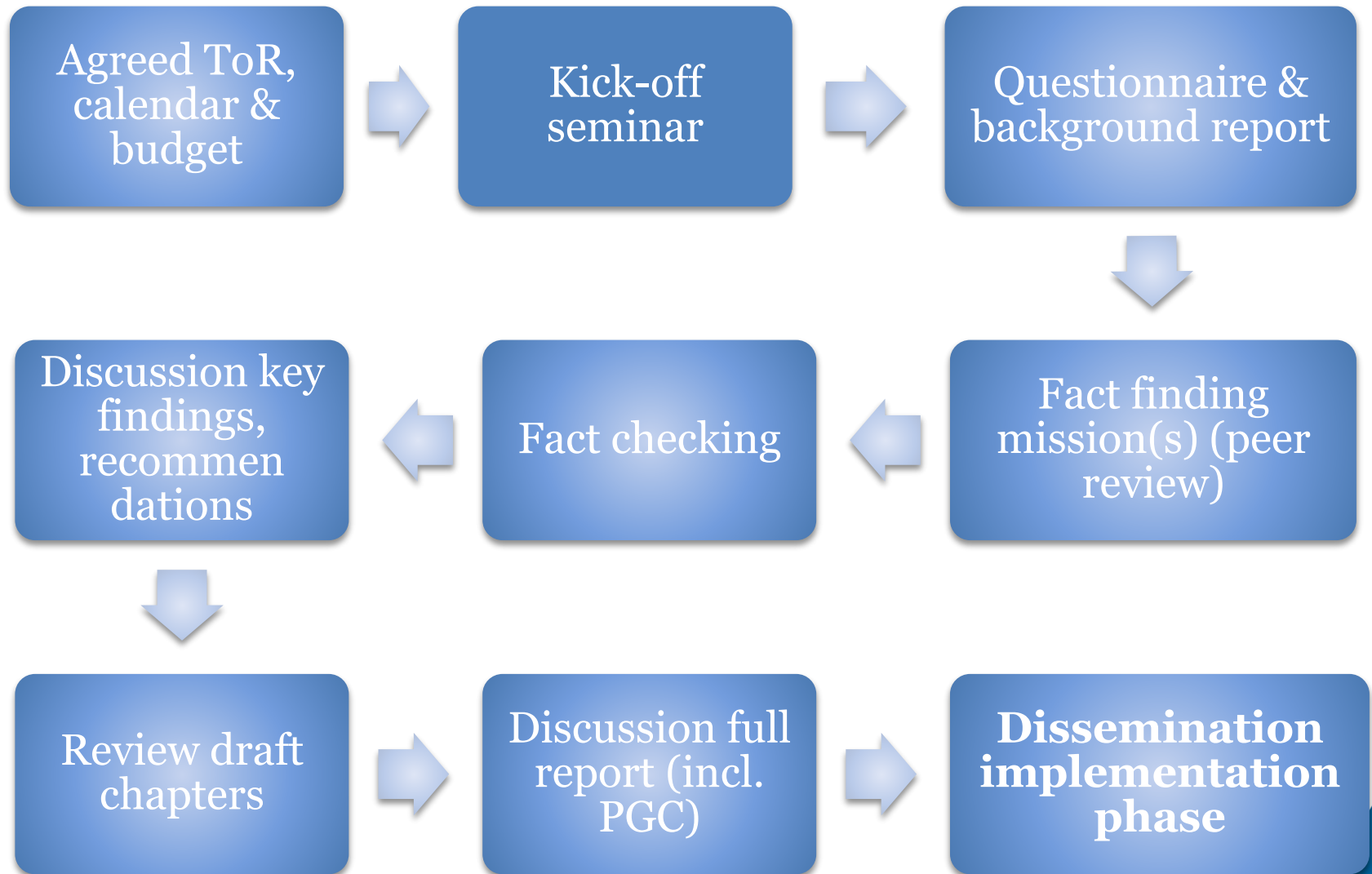

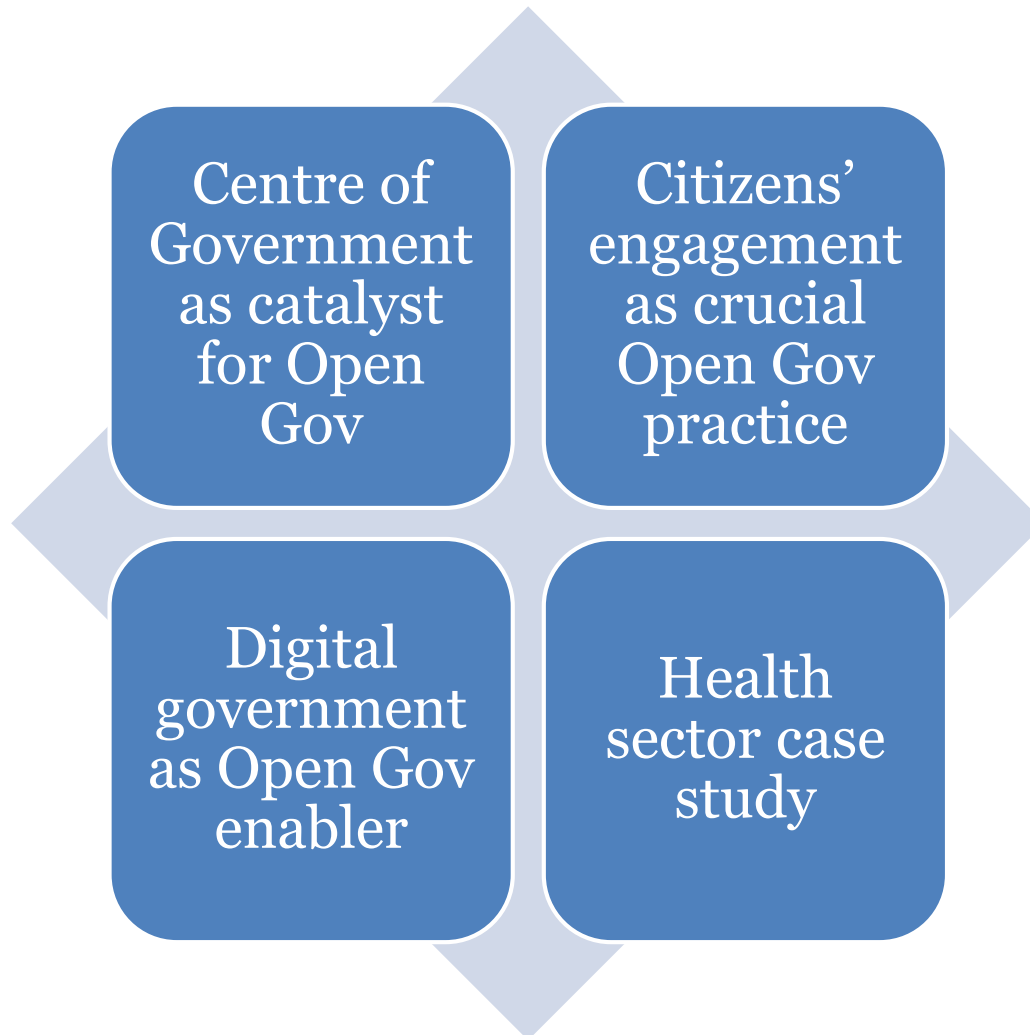

DIGITAL GOVERNMENT AS OPEN GOV ENABLER

Stronger monitoring & impact measurement and communication

Strengthen strategic leverage (agenda setting & institutional coordination)

Expand use of digital technology to tackle persistent corruption

Articulate & communicate the (political) importance of « getting digital government right »

Stimulate a culture of persuasion by illustration of benefits of good service design

Make an inventory of digital skills and capacities

Stimulate rigorous business case thinking including sound risk assessment practices



OPEN GOV IN THE HEALTH SECTOR

Use monitoring and evaluation to share information with stakeholders and promote accountability

Enhance the visibility of policy results

Improve the communication on the relation between different strategies and plans

Develop a strategy to promote open government throughout the sector

Improve citizens' participation (consultation mechanisms, NGO collaboration, anti-corruption strategy)

Use eHealth strategically (e.g. anti-corruption and accountability)
